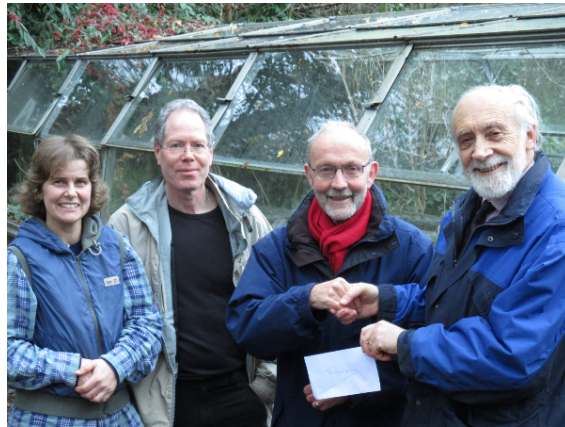
### Woods

#### New Paths in Grin Woods

The paths in Grin Woods have been restored and repaired and now look fantastic. The work will help to protect the delicate flora and wildlife by stopping the off path erosion, as well as helping more people to enjoy the woods by being more accessible. ## Panoramic View from Solomon's Temple

Lynne Noble a member of Buxton Civic Association has produced a brand new guide to the magnificent view from Solomon's Temple. The 360° panorama is divided into four overlapping sections as you move clockwise round the tower. Points of interest are clearly marked with tips on how to identify them (you don't need a compass!). Many of the features picked out help to explain the geology of the Peak District and the history of mining and quarrying around Buxton. Some of them are on the far horizon and are only visible on a really clear day. Did you know that you can see Mam Tor and Stanage Edge from Grin Low? The guides are on sale from the Visitor Centre at Poole's Cavern for £2 each.



## SERPENTINE PROJECT
